

### **EXPLORE THE SAN ANTONIO BOTANICAL GARDEN!**

Opened in 1980, the San Antonio Botanical Garden is a unique 33-acre living museum. Here you will enjoy colorful floral displays, a serene native forest walk, exotic specimens from around the world, futuristic glass pyramids and historic log cabins. We offer something for everyone!

# Garden Entrance

The Daniel Sullivan Carriage House, designed by Alfred Giles, was constructed in 1896 and moved stone by stone from its original location downtown. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, it now serves as the entry point to the Garden, and houses the gift shop and restaurant.

## Formal & Display Gardens

The Formal & Display Gardens consist of specialized displays designed for inspiration or education. Enjoy ever-changing display beds with their creative arrangements of textures, forms and colors. Reacquaint yourself with older flower varieties or discover great new selections in the Old-Fashioned Garden. Engage your senses of touch and smell in the Sensory Garden. Admire the newly revitalized Kumamoto En, a gift from our Sister City of Kumamoto, Japan, with its finely crafted structures and symbolic features.

## The Lucile Halsell Conservatory

Designed by architect Emilio Ambasz, the Lucile Halsell Conservatory features plants from around the world. This futuristic structure is an architectural icon for the City of San Antonio, and has been featured in numerous publications. View unusual orchids from the tropical forests of Asia and South America. Admire cacti from North America and euphorbias from Africa. Discover the diversity of ferns and explore an extensive collection of palms and cycads. Relax by the pond with its displays of hardy and tropical waterlilies.

# Watersaver Demonstration Areas

Visit the Watersaver Garden (above the Conservatory) and Watersaver Lane (near the Auld House) to learn about responsible landscaping with plants suited to our climate. Saving water has never looked prettier!

# Texas Native Trail

Take a "walk across Texas" along the 11-acre Texas Native Trail. Discover extensive collections representing three distinct regions of our vast and varied state, complemented by examples of regional pioneer dwellings.

- The *Hill Country* trail includes plants adapted to these rocky alkaline soils such as live oak and Uvalde maple. In spring wildflowers will blanket the meadow in front of the limestone spring. The recently restored *Schumacher House* was originally constructed in 1849 near Fredericksburg. The *Auld House* is a unique meeting facility adapted from an 1880s piñon pine cabin located near Leakey.
- The *East Texas Pineywoods* trail includes many acid-loving woodland species. The authentic hand-hewn post oak log cabin was built in the 1850s. Enjoy a stroll along our boardwalk beside the one-acre lake, which provides a home for black-bellied whistling tree ducks, wood ducks, mallards, green herons and more.
- The *South Texas* trail showcases dryland trees and shrubs. Wildflowers abound in the spring. Discover great birding, a palisado-adobe building and the cacti that populate this area of Texas.
